Subject: Property taxes and April 27 Public Comment

As a general statement, King William County should level fund all departments/budgets in FY 2021. The Governor has advised state agency to prepare for budget cuts.... Henrico, Chesterfield and Richmond have slashed millions (including Fire/EMS department) and cut positions.

1) King William should not buck the 4 year trend of lower taxes but the rate of \$0.73/\$100 for calendar year 2021 does that. According to the Commissioner of Revenue, home reassessments show an increase in property value of ~20%. A split rate of 0.86/\$100 of assessed value for calendar year 2020 and then \$0.73/\$100 of assessed value will cause homeowners to pay an additional \$29.
