- SJ 270: Constitutional amendment; Repeals "only a union between one man and one woman"
- SJ 271: Constitutional amendment; Permits a Governor elected in 2025 and thereafter to succeed himself in office. The amendment allows two four-year terms
- SB 660 Virginia Equal Pay Act; civil penalties.
- SJ 14 Constitutional amendment; qualifications of voters, restoration of civil rights (first reference).
- SB 887 Voter registration; automatic voter registration.
- SB 537 Mandatory minimum punishment; limitation.
- SB 490 Firearms; purchase, possession, etc., following a conviction.
- SB 917 Reproductive health services
- SJ 59 Constitutional amendment; qualifications of voters, restoration of rights.
- SJ 2 Constitutional amendment; Abortion on demand
- SB 449 Death penalty; abolishes penalty,
- HB 7 Virginia Fair Housing Law; unlawful discriminatory housing practices.
- HJ 2 Constitutional amendment; real property tax exemption for affordable housing
- HJ 80 Constitutional amendment; qualifications of voters, restoration of rights.
- HB 87 Marijuana; legalization of simple possession, penalties.
- HB 476 Police and court records; expungement of certain misdemeanor and nonviolent felony convictions.
- HB 1120 Tobacco products; tax on all tobacco products, penalties.
- HB 1713 Health insurance; essential health benefits, abortion coverage.
- HB 1433 Criminal history information; destruction of information for certain charges and convictions.
- HB 403 "Safe days" for employees; private employers required to allow days.
- HB 526 Reproductive health services; ...must be covered without cost sharing
- HB 333 Virginia Minimum Wage Act; exclusions.
- HB 177 Presidential electors; National Popular Vote Compact.
- HB 865 Misdemeanor drug offenses, certain; expungement.
- HB 961 Assault firearms, certain firearm magazines, etc.; prohibiting sale, transport, etc.,
- HB 219 Voter registration; automatic voter registration.
- HB 215 Voter registration; preregistration for persons age 16 or older

- HB 1288 Firearms; purchase, possession, etc., following certain convictions, penalty.
- HB 360 Elections; voter-nominated open primary elections,
- HB 1545 Discretionary sentencing guideline midpoints; act of domestic terrorism enhancement.
- HB 294 Police and court records; expungement of records, misdemeanor convictions.
- HJ 113 Constitutional amendment; marriage repeal of the constitutional amendment dealing with marriage that was approved by referendum at the November 2006 election.
- HB 729 Transit funding; raises the existing regional transportation fee, etc.
- HB 672 State, regional, and local planning; climate change. "Establishes a policy of the Commonwealth to prevent and to minimize actions that contribute to the detrimental effects of climate change in the Commonwealth. The bill requires any state agency to examine any new regulation in furtherance of this policy."
